

If I check my watch during a test, ProctorTrack might view that as cheating, or if I hear a noise outside of my dorm and look to see if my door is still locked that might be construed as me trying to claim an unfare edge. Other options might be a group project or presentation in place of an exam. When it comes to ProctorTrack, the thing that most concerns me is that I am being recorded. I also feel concerned for students with disabilities or conditions that require them to either stand up and take a 10 second walk/stretch(ADHD, autism), or use the bathroom (such as IBS, which would probably be influenced by the anxiety they get from not only writing the exam, but being watched and potentially failing the exam). like I said before, profs are giving us less than the bare minimum for writing exams and making them 10x harder to try and discourage us or prevent us from cheating. I would rather just write an exam like normal and NOT cheat rather than have so much anxiety over the exam because I KNOW it will be completely unreasonably hard. I also think its ridiculous to allow children and teens into schools every day and NOT let grown adults go into the school to write a socially distanced exam while wearing a mask. as a nursing student, its kind of insulting that the school doesn't trust my ability to wear a mask and practice proper hand hygiene. I had to spend \$40 on a course to learn how to put on an N95 mask, im pretty sure I can wear a cloth mask for 3 hours while writing an exam in person, at least 6 feet from other students. its NOT unrealistic that we can just write our exams in the gym. another problem I had was the inability to get on to my first exam. I was not informed that I would need to download google chrome. I sat on the phone for 30 minutes with IT support after my exam opened because I could not get on through safari. because so many students had issues with it, my prof had to TURN OFF Proctortrack. but, I was not informed about that, so I spent the rest of the day in anxiety wondering if I just messed up my chances in this course (it was an exam in which you only get two tries before you essentially get kicked out of the course.) in each exam, I have absolutely no idea if what I am doing is right, and whether or not my exam was even uploaded and submitted properly. on my first proctored exam, urcourses did not allow me to use the password that proctortrak gave me. i didn't know if i was allowed to quit the proctortrak session and start a new one (and we weren't given any instruction on what to do if it didn't work). while figuring out what to do, i wasted almost 15 minutes of my exam time and had to rush to finish the rest of the exam. it was an EXTREMELY stressful experience (10/26/2020 1:09:51 AM)

I wouldn't mind my teacher watching me/my screen during quizzes or exams as that would be little difference than in a classroom. However the fact that Proctortrack has access to the kernel level of my computer (the same level my antivirus and operating system work at means that it has the potential to take over my entire PC without resistance. I am very concerned this is going to impact me in a what I've way. I have generalized anxiety disorder and already have a hard time with exams and being recorded on camera makes me very stressed. I do not use FaceTime or zoom or Skype in my personal life because they provoke my anxiety and now I am forced to have added stress to an exam that already causes anxiety. The fact that I know I'm being watched adds to test anxiety and when I'm trying to think I tend to look around so I worry that it'll look like I'm cheating when I'm really not (10/26/2020 12:55:20 AM)

As a student with disabilities, the software is discriminatory in nature. Many students live with disabilities and must obtain accommodations for exams. The added stress and anxiety of ProctorTrack on top of working from home, the pandemic, exam stress/anxiety, mental health declining, etc has been crippling to students. Personally, I was given an accomodation for double time on an exam but when I went to begin, ProctorTrack would not allow me to open the exam for over 30 minutes, even after following the directions several times. As someone with an anxiety disorder among other things, I perceived being locked out of an exam for 30 minutes as an automatic failure for heing unable to use the program. I had to email my prof in a panic and wait for her to contact IT, after which IT had to contact me and walk me through getting into the exam. Not only did I lose valuable time on my exam, I was no longer in a healthy mental state to be taking an exam. Once I actually began the exam, my nerves were already shot and the added stress of being record and/or watched, possibly flagged due to my tics (which are aggrevated by stress/anxiety) and so on, made it near impossible to complete the exam. I studied very hard for the exam but my experiences prior to legitimately opening the exam resulted in a failure. Now I must work twice as hard to recuperate my losses from that to pass the course while I am trying to stay on top of my other courses, life, mental health, etc. (10/26/2020 1:18:40 AM)

Although I haven't had the experience of using proctortrack, I did complete the onboarding quiz which was quite uncomfortable because I had to give up a photo of my drivers license which has private information on it, the fact that it said "you are being monitored" gave me anxiety, not knowing who is on the other side. The fact that I am unable to drink water for 3+ hours, or use the washroom is ridiculous, these aren't rules for in-person tests so why is it a rule during a home test. I also have animals that can be a distraction, and I am unable to let my animals outside to go to the bathroom without being penalized is also ridiculous. If I even take my eyes away for a second, talk aloud, or use scrap paper which are all things that help think and organize my thoughts I will be penalized. I just believe it is very tedious, and if I accidentally make one false move I can be accused of cheating. All of these scenarios bring on severe anxiety for me, which I have been diagnosed with and am currently taking medication for. Make exams be projects, make the questions situational based so there is no way to cheat, there is other ways around this, and proctor track is the wrong way. The use of ProctorTrack has already caused me to switch majors. I am not afraid to withdraw from this university if ProctorTrack also gets in the way of my new major. When I tried to take my test through it, it did not login at all, till the last minute of the test because of that I was totally stressed and could not write my test. While I do any kind of test I like to really think about my answers and process questions first, which sometimes involves me staring off into space, if you will. I did this a few times and immediately tried to correct my behaviour, for fear that it would be flagged. A device on my internet network was flagged in the middle of the exam and I had to tell to my husband to unplug it, which I'm sure was flagged too—it was a fire stick for the tv. It asked for my browser history collection, extension basically controlling my whole pc banks, sin etc which makes me extremely worried about any internal, hacker leaking information or using them for his own benefits then being watched is not at all acceptable by a software/ as we are living in a world of A.I where nothing is impossible & all your characteristics & habits can be copied & used in the future everything that this app has given me makes me worried about my future, I would strictly ask university to use a strict time frame and teachers can check by the way of a student writes exam & can personally ask them in zoom breakout if they feel suspicious anytime to avoid plagiarism. I have no issue being virtually proctored. My issue is the particular software has caused me nothing but challenges and that makes the anxiety of writing an exam worse than it already is. Please know any benefit the uni thinks it's going to get from proctor track can be eliminated with even mild technical knowledge and a google search on how to circumvent proctor track. (10/26/2020 8:45:03 AM)

It has made my computer glitch and not work properly. (10/26/2020 8:10:36 AM)

I believe that usage of ProctorTrack is a hasty decision that needs to be reconsidered and re-evaluated on the basis of fair student representation. Online schooling is already stressful enough for every participating student at the time - a software with the capability to monitor the activities of a user's computer applications and hardware and a capability to make unintentional or illogical mistakes will only worsen morale. Professors should prioritize their exam content being applied knowledge that is unique to the course so cheating is next to impossible, or doing away with traditional exams and focusing on projects instead that encourage interaction, creativity, ingenuity, and applied thinking. I am lucky to only have one class using proctortrack, because the anxiety I felt during that midterm was unbearable. Since installing the software I have become very anxious about my privacy, with things becoming far worse once I found out about their security breech. Overall, this is far too invasive (even taking our biometrics such as keystroke pattern) and I feel like using something like a lockdown browser would be much more beneficial, as that would give us more privacy and take less of our personal information. ProctorTrack advertises that one of their features involves biometric facial scanning. If this feature is necessary now, it was necessary before the pandemic as well, so obviously this is unnecessary, as we didn't used to provide facial scans before entering the gym on campus. I always had a laptop but now my laptop is broken and to cost to repair the laptop is \$500+ and I can't afford it now. ProctorTrack gives me an anxiety as we are already in so much pressure then we have to worry about not do something stupid. Also, I recently found the job and I work during the day and it's hard to take days off and I cannot download this ProctorTrack because of the security breach and I have confidential data on my computer. The use of ProctorTrack is an invasion of privacy. It also causes severe anxiety in an already stressful situation. I have yet to get back a midterm that was a month ago, my professor said proctortrack was not allowing her to access them. As well I have trouble sitting still and we were told that looking anywhere but the screen would get us flagged as well as any talking. When I am taking tests my eyes look around the room while I search for information as well I mumble to myself to be able to get a clearer answer yet both of those things can potentially give me a zero on a test. I have a young child and I am a single parent, and with the amount of things this software can lock you out of an exam for, I will have to find a sitter for my child in the middle of a pandemic because she will not be able to come near me or speak to me during the exam. I would also have to board my dogs, because if they happen to bark during an exam, I could fail it. While I am in school, my "living allowance" (if you can call it that) is absolutely pitiful, and this makes finding a sitter very difficult. Not only that, I am risking putting my daughter in a different bubble of people, therefore putting both of our health and safety at risk. If we refer back to what I had said about that software being ableist, I would like to clarify what that means. ProctorTrack disables the right click. What are left handed people supposed to do with a left handed mouse? ProctorTrack also reads a USB mouse as an extra device, therefore cheating, but using my laptop track pad gives me a very noticeable disadvantage in regards to time. I would love to use my computer, but I do not own a webcam. Even if I did own a webcam, I do not have the room in my house to back my computer up to a blank wall in order to fit the parameters. I have been in classes with people in wheelchairs, who have limited mobility in their hands. How are these people supposed to take exams? But because I knew this would be immediately flagged as cheating, since I had reached over to turn it off, I went into panic mode. I started freaking out and crying on the camera, but I tried to keep going, because well, I had to. Then it happened again. My panicking got worse, and I ended up practically begging them to understand my situation - all while the exam counter was still going down. I wrote the rest of my exam, but I did very poorly as after all my panicking I forgot everything and just blanked, so I went on autopilot mode to hopefully at least pass the exam (which I did, but barely). Others yet have struggled with bandwidth issues and have found that their wifi, shared or otherwise, can't handle the increased strain of running a background program like ProctorTrack whilst in an exam. In all cases, some of these students live elsewhere without access to the U of R library, and some students are immunocompromised and not willing to expose themselves to that sort of public environment. Beyond this, I have heard from a few students

I have not used ProctorTrack specifically but I have taken a test using Prometric, another electronic invigilation company. I found the experience very stressful, both setting up for the exam and during the exam. I was required to be in a room free of writing, books, people and distractions. I did not have a room specifically for this purpose so I had to move some stuff around right before. I was also required to give a virtual tour of my room including under my chair and desk with a laptop camera, and the laptop must be plugged in at all times. This was pretty challenging. The person conducting the inspection asked me to grab a mirror to position so they could see my hands and keyboard at all times. I did not have a mirror ready so I had to go and look for something, while I was gone there was a problem with the service, my laptop froze on a blue screen and I had to restart my laptop. I frantically tried to reconnect to the exam using the software but it was 30 minutes into the scheduled exam time before I was able to reconnect to another agent, only to do the whole process over. For the duration of the exam I was extremely stressed and I am sure it negatively impacted my mark. If ProtorTrack is anything like this, I cannot recommend that it is used for exams. It is simply unreasonable for students to create an ideal testing environment at home and may not have access to required technology to have a stress free test. Thank you for issuing this survey. Additionally, I do not believe the use of ProctorTrack by professors is acceptable either. Due to the online learning environment (which is completely understandable due to the pandemic), students have been forced to upgrade their internet, buy laptops with minimum software requirements, or purchase webcams for existing laptops. Although students have changed to accommodate the new learning environment, many professors have refused to follow.

Many professors refuse to change their teaching style, the way classes are delivered, or the format of exams. For many of my courses (primarily in the humanities), exams could be substituted with take-home assignments, applied exam questions, or essays. I believe that their needs to be more pressure on professors to modify their courses to accommodate online learning, instead of trying to conjure up ways to keep everything the same. Being a student with a disability is very challenging. And now that schooling has been shifted online, I am now trying to adapt to a new leaning environment that I was not previously used to for the first three years of my university experience. Times are challenging for everyone. I feel this system just adds more stress to students. I strongly feel like students with disabilities are being overlooked while using this software. I have been told my the licensed professional who diagnosed me that during exams I should take a few minutes to take a short break if needed. I understand the concern for the violation of academic integrity. However, for students, it's the concern of feeling secure and confident while using the software. These needs are not being justified for the students by the university. There should be a better alternative solution rather than a violation of the privacy of this software. There has to be a different solution to better monitor student exams. With my experience using ProtorTrack for financial exams, it

was stressful knowing I was not able to use paper to figure out mathematical questions. I am more concerned about math courses because protortrack is strict on eye-movement and other rules. (10/26/2020 1:00:11 PM)

They got hacked, which means they are not secure and i do not believe for a second that no user data was compromised. Also one of my professors intends to use it for our open book final exam which i assume to mean she's just going to receive a flagged recording of every one of her students - professors haven't been educated on the details of the program. How well can proctor track detect whether students are cheating or just writing out the answers with integrity? I read questions and talk to myself out loud in order to process it all properly and that gets flagged on proctortrack. Also not being able to look away while thinking makes it way harder to focus. I am more concerned about getting flagged for my normal movements than I am actually focusing on the exam. (10/26/2020 3:45:13 PM)

I am a second-year student in the faculty of kinesiology, majoring in human kinetics. Unfortunately, I've run into multiple issues with Proctor Track. On September 15th, when Dr. Harold Riemer sent an email to students stating that the only way to avoid using Proctor Track was to drop classes, that's exactly what I did. With only a few hours until the drop date, I checked all my syllabi and only remained enrolled in classes that did not include the use of Proctor Track in their syllabus. I chose to drop two courses that I was hoping to take and added a class that I was planning on taking this coming winter. I was

initially concerned about my privacy and the fact that my computer is 8 years old, but I also recognized a clash with my accommodations. Part of my accommodations have been set up to allow me to be apart from people, and thus avoid possible distractions. As I was writing an exam last week, I felt extremely stressed and was constantly worrying about how I appeared. I move around and fidget quite a bit, and I also find that my eyes wander. My greatest fear is being accused of cheating because of this. I was quite distracted by these thoughts and felt as if the grade I received does not reflect the time, and effort I have put into learning the material. Furthermore, after the drop date, I discovered that two of my classes were planning on using Proctor Track for the exams though that was NOT stated in the syllabus. This was really upsetting for me because there is no way I would be able to get a refund or even register for a new class. I reached out to the URSU student advocate and frankly I feel like that was a waste of time. The only useful information that came out of that interaction was that the library computers can be used for writing exams. I also chose to reach out to Doug Cripps who was somewhat able to help the situation - for midterms at least but nothing has been said about finals. As of right now, I am torn between taking courses that are only in the faculty of science, taking a semester off to work, or transferring to another school. I intend to register in a few kinesiology courses in hopes that next semester will be different. If it is not, thankfully first-year science courses aren't always full. (10/26/2020 3:47:31 PM)

I have to use ProctorTrack for one of my four courses. While taking tests, when I am thinking I normally look at a wall or just an empty space to think things through. When I had ProctorTrack this causes an added stress because I know it is watching eye movement and didn't want to be wrongly accused of anything. So not only was I stressed about my first mid-terms, I was also stressed because I was being recorded and tracked of what I was doing, and I felt I couldn't do my default thinking action which made everything more difficult. I think at least knowledge of what is being tracked and how and what we CAN do is important knowledge to give to students using ProctorTrack. Before my test there was a big long list of what we CAN"T do, including having food or drink. I personally drink a lot of water and this bothered me as it is kind of calming to me and being thirsty in an important test does not help on top of everything. It also indicated that there is no calculators, scrap paper, or anything to aid in thinking. I thought that was ridiculous and makes me fear taking classes in the next semester that may require those such items. The other issue I have is how this software was implemented. I first found out about the use of this software by the University through a Facebook post from a concerned student. At no point before this was there any public notice that the software would be used or any consultation with the student body at large which indicates to me that the admin wanted to keep this as quiet as possible to avoid this kind of conflict. The subsequent email sent out by the university admin did little to ease the concerns, stating, in effect, that the dominant reason for choosing this software was that several other Canadian universities were also using it. The software was flagging my TV's firestick from 2 floors up and telling me to stop it from running. I live in a house with other people, I can't regulate who watches TV and when because I'm taking online courses. Furthermore, no one was even using the firestick at that moment but it still was getting flagged! I believe Proctortrack is way too invasive if it's picking up & flagging something like that! It flagged my computer for another program (powershell I believe the warning called it, not sure). However, I didn't have any other windows/apps open and don't even know what that program is that it wanted me to stop. So I didn't even know what to do to make it stop flagging it. Over the course of my exam it flagged me at least 6 times. The situation made me feel extremely stressed, distracted, anxious, and caused fogginess during my exam. I feel the result shows in my mark from that exam. Additionally, every time this warning showed up, it covered my screen front and center. I was writing a TIMED exam and needed every second I could get. But with Proctortrack's continuous warnings popping up on my screen I couldn't read the content of my exam! It only further distracted me, stressed me, slowed me down, and took valuable time away from my exam. I emailed my professor and let her know this experience was not good. The next time I had to use Proctortrack, the entire URCourses shut down. The whole situation with this software is horrible. I have a disability and I receive accommodations for writing my exams, which includes a quiet space and computer to type. To me, this experience with Proctortrack was the equivalent of someone covering my screen with their hand so I couldn't read/write the exam and yelling at me to stop what I was doing. I have anxiety when writing exams. This anxiety is low and often manageable through short coughing periods and lots of water. When using ProctorTrack my Prof did not allow any students to have access to food and water. Water used to be allowed in classroom exams so I was surprised to find out I could no longer have it during my exam period. It was also noted that turning away from the camera would hurt the integrity of my exam. I would naturally turn away from the camera to cough. So my anxiety was worst when taking a ProctorTrack exam since I could not easily using the coping techniques I have used during exam periods when the exam was taking at the school. I am also in my last semester (may take one more depending on whether the software is used and what is happening with Covid) so instead of seeking help I have been suffering through my exams. I do think that the software is decent to use however feel like it could be beneficial to lower some of the things that affect your integrity rating. At minimum, a student should still have access to the things they had access to during an exam that was taken in the school.
